Light disrupting the darkness

To be blind is to live in total darkness. But Bartimaeus was really totally blind! That is to say, he was physically, totally blind. But he was not totally 'spiritually' blind.

Mark 10:52 is telling about the same story, he saw and heard something that Luke didn't hear. Jesus saith unto him go thou way thy faith had made you whole. When we think of disruption we have a tendency to think of commotion and noise, **disruption doesn't have to be a noise to be disruptive**, it means a change of normal. To break the order, the routine. Light is a privilege, don't take it for granted.
