Sermon Notes: *We need the darkness to see the Light*

Psalm 23 was not written during a peaceful time in King David's life. The phrase "shadow of death" is actually a mild translation. David is not referring to passing shadows or twilight; he is referring to total darkness.

David wrote this psalm and he was a shepherd before he became king. Followed in his fathers footsteps. He took the experiences he had as a shepherd and his relationship with the sheep and uses them to mirror our relationship with God.
