What is in your hand today?

The things that we hold in our life could be insignificant or useless or limited. But God desires to use the **things** we carry/hold in our hands for His glory. For Moses it was a rod that he was holding it.

That rod identified him. It showed his personality of who he is. That stick controlled his life. That stick said, *"All you will ever be is a shepherd keeping another man's sheep"*.
